

## How to create a cross-hatch emboss with Art Deckle



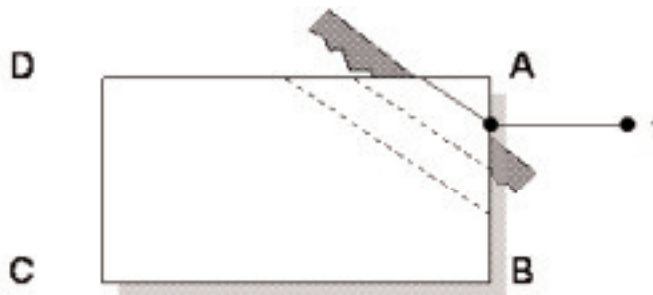
### You will need:

- Art Deckle tool (12" or longer size tool generally preferred)
- Paper
- Stylus
- Hard, smooth work surface

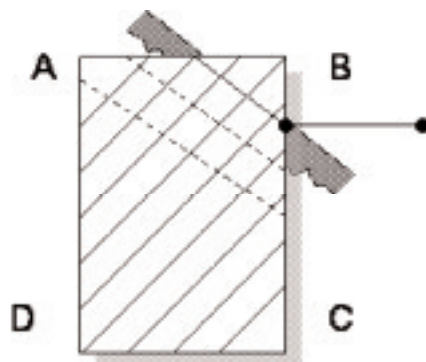
Cross hatching lends a dramatic embossed raised texture either as a background, border or trim detail. Since either the straight or deckled edge of the tool may be used with the Logan Stylus, you will be inspired to create different patterns and shapes.

Embossed cross hatch is deceptively easy because the rotation happens only once, from two opposing corners of the paper, not with each line of emboss. The Art Deckle tool must extend beyond the length of the diagonal width of the paper in order to emboss the lines evenly.

The cross hatch patterns may consist of random width, straight lines, creating a blind plaid like design.



Begin embossing at corner "A" to corner "C" leave tool stationary while sliding paper upward for completion of lines across page or desired area.



Turn paper as shown, repeat process across entire page or from corner B to corner D
